

## CONSERVATION

Kyabram Fauna Park has been actively involved in conservation programs with Australian and international partners since 1979 with a focus on threatened and vulnerable species. We have been involved in breeding and captive management programs for the eastern barred bandicoot, koalas, brolga, pied geese, Cape Barren geese, alpine dingo, bush stone-curlew and Tasmanian devils.

The Park was established in 1976 on 55 hectares of degraded, flood prone land. Park staff and volunteers have planted more than 7000 native trees and plants to create a range of habitats. These habitats provide food and shelter for free-ranging wildlife and have encouraged the return of 35 species of birds. We are working to remove non-indigenous plants, trees and noxious weeds.

Staff and volunteers have completed extensive work on the wetlands at the Park and today the ponds hold Kyabram's runoff rainwater. More than 105 species of wildlife have been recorded at the wetlands. Many waterfowl spend their spring and summer at the Park.

## SCHOOL GROUPS

Kyabram Fauna Park welcomes school groups to the Park to learn about native wildlife and the environment.

We offer a hands-on learning experience for students from kindergarten to university. Students will enjoy talks from our experienced keepers and close-up animal encounters with the Park's native wildlife. Our on-site Education Centre is a terrific setting for students to learn about Australia's unique flora and fauna.
